Technicians are responsible for drafting the plans and drawings made by the building services engineer using Computer Aided Design (CAD) and Building Information Management (BIM).

Technicians require accurate skills sets and attention to detail as this will impact the work of the engineer.

This is an opportunity to understand all aspects of building services and gain knowledge of the industry which could lead to progressing a graduate engineer.

Starting salaries can be between £13,000 and £15,000 a year

A CAD technician can earn between £25,000 and £37,000

A Revit/BIM technician can earn between £28,000 and £38,000 a year

TYPICAL TASKS FOR A BUILDING SERVICES TECHNICIAN:

- Liaising with manufacturers and suppliers in connection with the CAD drawings.
- Assist in the implantation of health and safety standards and building regulations.
